There is a lot happening this week and the rest of the month!

Saffron Presentations

On November 21 and 22 Saffron will be presenting the sessions, below, to our students. These are great to follow up with a discussion at home.

Kindergarten and Gr. 1 - Llamas Spit

This story-led presentation allows young students to learn about how different animals respond when they feel scared or uncomfortable. They are encouraged to act out the actions alongside the story as we talk about how different animals either freeze, flee, or fight when frightened. Students can talk about how these different actions feel and what these reactions might tell us about someone's level of comfort.

Kindergarten and Gr. 1 - Percy's Got a Bubble!

This story-led presentation for young students begins the conversation on healthy boundaries by following Percy – a small, golden puppy – as he learns about his personal bubble. Percy learns how to tell his friend Elsie that she has crossed his physical and emotional boundaries so that their friendship can be strengthened. He also learns the importance of talking to a trusted adult when he is experiencing big feelings or feeling uncomfortable in any way.

Grade 2, 4 and 5 - My Body, My Boundaries

The presentation begins by exploring what boundaries are and the different types they may have: emotional, physical, and online. Next it discusses how to share your own boundaries with conversation examples and who you should be sharing your boundaries with. Then, it shows how to listen to other people's boundaries, including how to look for signs you are crossing someone else's boundary. Followed by talking about trusted adults.

Grade 3 and 6 - Internet Safety

This presentation begins by discussing the importance of integrity and responsibility when using the internet. We then introduce the concept of trusted adults and explore their role in internet safety. This presentation covers the risks and the available safety features of many popular websites and apps including YouTube, Snapchat Instagram, Tik Tok, and gaming sites. We also briefly discuss online scams and what students can watch out for. Finally, we talk about cyberbullying and the negative effects it can have, while introducing the practice of empathy when understanding those negative impacts on others.

Giant Indigenous Floor Map

All students in the school will have to opportunity to visit the giant floor map in the gym, tomorrow. They will learn about indigenous cultures in Canada, Residential Schools, and truth and reconciliation.

Grades 1-3 Christmas Concert

Our grade 1 - 3 Christmas Concert will be held on Thursday, December 7 at 7:00 p.m. Because of limited seating we are asking parents to pre-book tickets for the evening. You should have received a google form link on Nov 20 and each family will be able to book 2 tickets at this time. Bookings will be open from Nov. 20 to Nov. 23. The concert will also be live streamed so it can be watched from home.

For families who would like to bring additional guests a second round of tickets will be made available from Nov. 27 to Nov. 30, on a first come first served basis. 
Seating will be on a first come basis. Doors will open at 6:30.
